Wool Craft

Developing gross motor and fine motor skills at the Pre-Primary level is given as much importance as the development of language or cognitive skills. To develop their fine motor skills KG children had to wind wool around a cat shaped cut-out, leaving no space and preferably no overlapping. This activity helped them to enhance their fine motor skills, eye-hand coordination along with language development.

Celebrating with Math Skills

Makar Sankranti is a festival known for flying kites and eating sesame sweets. This day is said to mark the end of winter in our country. It is also a time of joy for farmers in the hope of getting a new crop. To mark this festival of joy and happiness KG Shreeyans enjoyed a special Art & Craft activity - making colourful kites by pasting triangles, squares & diamonds. They coloured the sky using their own imagination. This activity helped them to explore their creative and aesthetic sense while exploring their cultural heritage.



























<u>Learning about National Symbols of</u> <u>India</u>

The New Year 2021 started on a patriotic note as Republic Day was round the corner. In addition to this, the Theme for the month in the Pre-primary was 'My country India'. The Shreeyans learned about some National Symbols which included the national animal – tiger, national fruit – mango and the national flower – lotus etc. These were created by the Shreeyans using different art techniques like tear & paste, painting, colouring with crayons etc. Through this activity, the Shreevans learnt about mixing two colours to create another colour. The activity also enhanced their pincer grip and fine motor skills along with creative and aesthetic skills.

It's Rhyme Time



Rhymes in the early school years are an important tool for vocabulary building and language development, particularly speaking skills and building confidence. Rhymes are used to introduce various concepts to the children in a fun way and help in retention of information. The Shreeyans of Nursery KG had an interesting class activity in which they recited their favorite Hindi rhymes using appropriate props. The children recited the rhymes with great enthusiasm and also enjoyed listening to rhymes recited by their classmates.











Republic Day Celebration

India is a country with a rich and diverse social and cultural heritage. This is reflected in its various languages, religions and dresses, to name a few.

Our Pre-primary Shreeyans showcased this diversity by dressing up in attire from different states of India as part of the Republic Day celebration. This activity helped them appreciate the variety of dresses worn in different parts of India and also instilled a feeling of pride in our nation's diversity, the basic essence of Incredible India! They also learnt about the National flag of India. The Shreeyans of PN, Nursery & KG created different craft work using the three colours of our national flag.



































Learning Math Through Play Dough

To help them understand the concept of 'Take away' (subtraction), Kindergarten teachers planned an interesting activity for the KG Shreeyans. Children made balls with clay as per the first number card shown by the teacher. To take away they squashed the clay balls as per the second number shown on the screen. This activity helped the Shreeyans develop their logical thinking skills and work on their fine motor skills as well.

Learning About Water Animals

There is a whole different world existing underwater. Children find creatures that live in water very fascinating. The Shreeyans were introduced to some water animals like dolphins, whales, sharks, crabs, jellyfish etc. through a presentation. As a part of their theme project for the month, Kindergarten Shreeyans made a craft of a sea creature (fish/dolphin/whale/seahorse) in the sea; wherein the water waves were made by tearing pasting different shades of blue glazed paper. It was a sensory experience while enhancing their fine motor skills.













Integrated Craft Activity on Birds

The theme for the month of February was Birds. The Shreeyans of Nursery made a bird craft using cutouts of shapes. They pasted different coloured circles and triangles of different sizes, to make a beautiful and colourful bird. The activity enhanced their knowledge of shapes and colours and improved their fine motor co-ordination.

Basant Panchami

Basant Panchami marks the beginning of spring season. It is also Saraswati Puja. Saraswati, the goddess of knowledge and wisdom is worshipped on this day. People celebrate the day by wearing yellow, worshiping goddess Sarasvati, eating sweets and decorating yellow flowers at home.

Indian-ness is one of the core values that we endeavour to instil in Shreeyans. Basant Panchami celebration was one such step in that direction. Pre-Primary Shreeyans were dressed in yellow. They started the day by offering prayers to Goddess Saraswati. The children were also shown a short presentation on Basant Panchami which informed them about the importance of the day and the manner in which it is celebrated.

















Learning about Day and Night

Day time is when we can see the sun from where we are, and its light and heat can reach us. Night time is when the sun is on the other side of the Earth from us, and its light and heat does not reach us. To reinforce this concept, the Kindergarten Shreeyans made a house using shapes, on a half blue and half black sheet, to depict day and night respectively. The children used their imagination and drew things that they see during the day and at night. The Shreeyans got an opportunity to express their creativity while reinforcing some Math and Theme concepts.

Numbers Fun with Play Dough

Children love playing with play dough. It is a great way for them to exercise their fingers while using their creativity. The Nursery teachers devised an interesting activity using play dough for the Shreeyans to practice the formation of numbers in a fun way and practice the quantity associated with each number as well. This activity was simple to set up and a great way to achieve the learning objectives for the Shreeyans, to form the numbers and visually see the quantities. It was truly a 'play and learn' experience.













Holi Hai

Spring season in our country is not only a treat to our eyes with colourful flowers, it brings Holi, the festival of colours! India is a land of festivals. Holi is undoubtedly, the most popular among them for children. As part of Holi celebrations, the Shreeyans were shown a presentation on the story about Holi, the story of Prahlad and Holika. They also talked about how to follow rules and play a safe Holi. As a fun festival craft, the Shreeyans of Pre-Nursery made a 'pichkari' by pasting different shapes and Shreeyans of Nursery made colourful hand prints on a sheet. Festivals in India aren't complete without sweets and eats; the Nursery Shreeyans decorated cup cakes with cream, gems and multi-coloured sprinkles and Shreeyans of KG made 'chatpata' Sev-Puri and enjoyed them with their class mates. The celebration helped understand the importance of the festival, and celebrating together, even online, is fun!

Grade I Shreeyans participated enthusiastically in the Republic day assembly and created our National symbols (National bird, flower, animal and fruit) through different art forms.
















Just A Minute




































When Words Play 'Hide and Seek' - Exploring Idioms and More!

The young mathematicians also learnt about Roman numbers by writing their date of birth, house number etc. using Roman numbers.


































Flipping the Classroom ...








Going Back in Time!























Inquisitive Minds @ Work!




WORLD CITIZENS' SUMMIT-STIMULATING CREATIVE THOUGHT AND EXPRESSION

In order to provide the 21st century learners the inimitable opportunity to collaborate with proactive minds from all across the world in discussions of policies and affairs that are bound to impact the citizens as well as inculcate the spirit of citizenship, Tarang a non-profit organization conducted The World Citizens' Summit 2021 from 8th January to 10th January via Zoom.

Eight Shreeyans of Grades IX and XI participated in this two and a half day event galvanizing logical and critical thinking. The event comprised of different competitions ranging from open debate to policy presentation to parliamentary debate and election simulation based on the unique themes and topics related to political, social and economic domains.

While all eight students qualified Round 1 and Round 2, Jessica Preet and Navyaa Jain of Grade IX qualified all four rounds of the event- the Open Debate round, the Policy Presentation round, the Parliamentary Debate round and the Election Manifesto round. Jessica Preet's policy paper on 'Sewage treatment plants in Pamur' won her the second position. Navyaa Jain and Jessica Preet's bloc of 7 members won the first position for presenting the best Election Manifesto and were declared winners of the Election Simulation round.

The winners were awarded with an internship and special workshops organized by Sampoorna Manostithi, an organization that works towards bringing about a positive change in the area of mental health.





STIMULATING INGENUITY- NATIONAL ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION

Around twenty Shreeyans participated in the Heartfulness Essay writing event organized by Shri Ram Chandra Mission in collaboration with United Nations Information Centre for India and Bhutan. 
BASANT PANCHAMI CELEBRATION AT GYANSHREE...
