

Foundational Years

Learning about Myself, My Body

The Shreeyans also pasted different shapes to create their body. In this way the Shreeyans learnt about parts of their body and about themselves.










Echoes of Tagore "Reach high, for stars lie hidden in you. Dream deep, for every dream precedes the goal."


